WARNER, JOHN, Private, No. 9310, 1st Battn. Royal Fusiliers; served with the Expeditionary Force; killed in action at Soupir 22 Sept. 1914; *m.*

WARNETT, WALTER E. S., L.-Sergt., No. 9606, 1st Battn. Royal West Kent Regt., *s.* of Frank Warnett, of Sevenoaks; served with the Expeditionary Force; killed in action 19 Sept. 1914.

WARNOCK, HECTOR HUGH ADOLPHUS, Lieut., 4th, attd. 1st (87th Foot), Battn. Royal Irish Fusiliers, eldest *s.* of the late Hugh Warnock, Medical Officer Clogher Dispensary, by his wife, Massie I., dau. of the late William Stewart, of Lislane; *b.* Clogher, 27 Feb. 1893; educ. St. Columba's College, Rathfarnham, and Trinity College, Dublin, where he was in the O.T.C. On the outbreak of war he obtained a 2nd Lieutenancy in the Royal Irish Fusiliers 15 Aug. 1914, and was promoted Lieut. May, 1915; went to France in June, and died at Bapaume 16 Aug. following, from wounds received in action on the 12th, while on patrol duty. Buried at Bapaume. A comrade wrote saying he was a great favourite with both officers and men in his battalion, and they greatly regretted this promising young officer; *unm.*



WARREN, ARTHUR ERNEST, A.B., J. 8681, R.N., 2nd *s.* of the late Arthur Henry Warren, by his wife, Euphemia Georgiana (135, Baker Street, Enfield), dau. of the late Alfred Sorrell, Crimean Veteran; *b.* Norton Green, near Bury St. Edmunds, co. Suffolk, 24 Sept. 1894; educ. St. Michael's School, Enfield; was for a time employed in a Printer's office; joined the Navy, 26 June, 1910; trained on H.M.S. Impregnable and H.M.S. Inconstant; served on H.M.S. Hampshire, which ship he left in China, returning to England on H.M.S. *March*, 1914.
